

2008-2009 Child Development Permits

The Child Development Training Consortium has two sources of funding to pay application and fingerprint (Live Scan) processing fees for Child Development Permit applicants. Each funding source has different eligibility criteria and levels of permits it funds. An overview of both programs follows:

Application Procedures for Both Programs (CDD and First 5):

1. Visit the CDTC Web site at www.childdevelopment.org or call the Child Development Training Consortium (CDTC) office to request an application packet, 209.572.6080. Specify the program for which you qualify, CDD or First 5 for eligibility criteria.

2. Obtain the state forms required by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (Commission) from the Commission's Website. The Commission will no longer mail the state forms. The Commission's website is www.ctc.ca.gov.

For Teacher, Master Teacher, Site Supervisor, and Program Director Permits **only**. Follow the prompts on the CTC website.

It is recommended that you initiate renewal of your current permit six months prior to its expiration date.

State form required by Permit Upgrade applicants:

3. Complete all forms and return them to the Child Development Training Consortium (CDTC) office for processing. Follow all instructions carefully. You will be notified by letter when the CDTC submits your permit application to the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing.

Allow approximately three months for processing after your permit application has been submitted to the Commission on Teacher Credentialing by the CDTC.

IMPORTANT: Effective September 1, 2008, the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (Commission) will only provide credentials, certificates, and permits through an online view and print process. The Commission will no longer print and mail these documents; they will be available online to colleges, universities, employers and the document holder within 48 hours of issuance. At that time, a document may be printed from the Commission's website.

Permits are processed on a first come, first served basis
within the priorities described above.
